
Supporting the Education and Training of Health Care Professionals

International medical graduates (IMGs) comprise about 25 percent of the physician workforce in the United States and are essential to accessible, high-quality health care. ECFMG Certification, our foundational program, is the standard for evaluating the readiness of IMGs to enter U.S. health care. In recent years, ECFMG has certified more than 11,000 physicians from more than 130 countries annually.

about EVSP

Foreign national IMGs add diversity to health care teams and enrich clinical learning and practice environments with international perspectives. In 2024, ECFMG's Exchange Visitor Sponsorship Program (EVSP) provided J-1 visa sponsorship for more than 15,900 foreign national physicians to participate in U.S. training programs. These programs provide IMGs with the opportunity to learn and train in the United States. Intealth's advocacy efforts support them and the vital role they play in U.S. health care.

regions of the world to provide fellowship programs for health professions educators. The participants of these programs, known as FAIMER Fellows, complete a two-year fellowship designed to teach education methods, leadership, scholarship, research skills, project management, and evaluation. FAIMER Fellows develop a strong network of health professions educators around the world. Many Fellows are now leaders in improving health professions education at their institutions and within their countries.

Informing Health Workforce Policies

Rapid growth in the number of medical schools worldwide and increasing migration of physicians are creating a greater need for information on medical schools and the organizations that accredit them. Intealth maintains extensive databases on international medical schools and accrediting agencies and focuses its research in these areas to inform policy makers. Intealth is a driving force for the international adoption of standards for medical school accrediting agencies. Known as the Recognized Accreditation Policy, this initiative is stimulating accreditation efforts worldwide. The progress has been dramatic.
